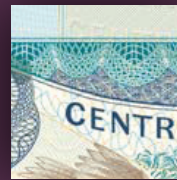

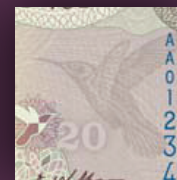

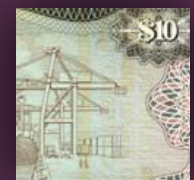

#### SEE THE DIFFERENCE

Printed lines and colours  
are sharp and clear.

#### COMPARE

If you think you've gotten a  
suspect note, hold it side by  
side with another of the same  
denomination and series.



*Notes bearing the signature of  
Governor Jwala Rambarran went  
into circulation in November 2013.  
All previous bills remain legal tender.*

Several series of notes are in circulation simultaneously;  
all of which are legal tender. However most notes in  
circulation are 2002 and 2006 Series.

issue and redeem currency notes and coins.
